Topic : Artificial Intelligence

Synopsis - The School of Computer Science and Electronic Engineering is a top-notch research institution known for its work in Human-centred Artificial Intelligence, Computer Games, and Robotics. In this talk, I'll take you on a journey, starting with the basics of Artificial Intelligence and moving on to how it's used in things like games and robots.
